To provide laboratories with a better means to engage in and meet their accreditation requirements, the CAP has enhanced the checklist content and updated its design. New components containing additional information for both the laboratory and inspectors include Subject Headers, Declarative Statements and Evidence of Compliance.

CAP Personnel Requirements by Testing Complexity

College of American Pathologists (CAP) Retention of Laboratory Records and Materials. The College of American Pathologists makes the following recommendations for the minimum requirements for the retention of laboratory records and materials. They meet or exceed the regulatory requirements specified in the Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments of 1988 (CLIA 88).

College of American Pathologists (CAP) Retention of ...

No specific requirements outlined in the CAP or CLIA regulations, however each laboratory must ensure waived testing personnel meet facility- defined minimum requirements and have records of training and competency assessment 1. MD or DO with a current medical license²; OR 2.

CAP Personnel Requirements by Testing Complexity*

CAP requires that all high complexity testing personnel have earned at least a minimum of an associate degree in a laboratory science or medical technology from an accredited institution. Personnel performing moderately complex testing must have earned a high school diploma or equivalent.

Guide to CAP Accreditation

•Competency must be assessed at the specific laboratory (CAP/CLIA number) where testing is performed. •All test performance variations must be included in the competency assessment specific to the site or laboratory. •Records may be maintained centrally within a health care system. •Records must be available upon request.
