The southern Serbs wavered for long periods in their ecclesiastical allegiance between Rome and Constantinople (now Istanbul); the consecration of St. Sava as autocephalous archbishop of Serbia in 1219, however, aligned the various Serbian principalities into one ecclesiastical whole behind Constantinople. As the kingdom of Serbia grew in size and prestige and Stefan Dušan, king of Serbia from 1331, assumed the imperial title of tsar in 1346 to 1355, the archbishopric of Peć was ...

After World War I all the Serbs were united under one ecclesiastical authority, and the Patriarchate was reestablished in 1920 with election of Patriarch Dimitry,
