The copper was bought from the Venetians, who obtained it from mines in Eastern Europe. Small copper coins, based on Byzantine issues and called fals, or fulus in the plural, had been known in the early centuries of Islam but had then virtually disappeared - though fulus still means "money" in colloquial Arabic today. The reinstitution of a copper coinage during late Mamluk times was directly related to the sudden scarcity of silver.
