Management of Nonvariceal Upper Gastrointestinal Bleeding ...

An international consensus group has updated its 2010 guidelines on managing nonvariceal upper gastrointestinal bleeding (UGIB) in the Annals of Internal Medicine. Among the changed recommendations: Resuscitation should be started for patients with acute UGIB and hemodynamic instability. Clinicians should use a Glasgow Blatchford score of 1 or under to determine whether patients are at very low risk for rebleeding or mortality.

Although the cause of a bleeding episode is uncertain until endoscopy is undertaken, guidelines often separate upper gastrointestinal bleeding into variceal and non-variceal bleeding because management and outcomes differ. 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 This article covers the acute management of patients with overt upper gastrointestinal bleeding, summarizing evidence for risk assessment, resuscitation, blood transfusion, medical and endoscopic therapy, and early post-endoscopic management.

This guideline presents recommendations for the step-wise management of patients with overt upper gastrointestinal bleeding. Hemodynamic status is first assessed, and resuscitation initiated as needed. Patients are risk-stratified based on features such as hemodynamic status, comorbidities, age, and laboratory tests.

Upper gastrointestinal bleeding is a common medical emergency worldwide and refers to bleeding from the esophagus, stomach, or duodenum. Patients present with hematemesis (bloody or coffee ground emesis) or melena, although hematochezia can occur in the context of a major bleed and is typically associated with hemodynamic insta - bility.

Defi ned anatomically as bleeding in the upper gastrointestinal tract proximal to the ligament of Treitz,7 AUGIB should be suspected in patients with haematemesis, coffee-ground vomiting, melaena or unexplained fall in haemoglobin. The initial evaluation of patients with acute upper GI bleeding involves an assessment of hemodynamic stability and resuscitation if necessary.

To maintain normothermia, avoid exposure, use a blood warmer for all products and consider a bair hugger early. Avoid acidosis and ensure adequate ionised calcium levels are maintained, ie above 1.13mmol/L by giving calcium gluconate 2.2mmol (10ml) peripherally IV over 10minutes.
